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## OSIG BEGINS 2020 VISITS TO VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES FACILITIES

The Virginia Office of the State Inspector General (OSIG) visited Eastern State Hospital (ESH), one of 13 facilities operated by the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Development Services, recently as part of OSIG's initiative this year to gain a better understanding of how the facilities operate and how patients are treated. OSIG's Behavioral Health and Development Services (BHDS) Unit is tasked with inspecting, monitoring and reviewing the quality of services at the state-operated facilities.

OSIG's leadership team met with ESH management, spoke with staff, took a tour of the facility and met with patients. "Part of OSIG's duty is to keep the General Assembly and Joint Commission on Health Care informed of significant problems and investigate specific complaints of abuse, neglect or inadequate care," said State Inspector General Michael C. Westfall. "These visits, in addition to our annual unannounced inspections of state facilities, allow OSIG to monitor these facilities and let people know we are here to help." OSIG is scheduled to visit Central State Hospital and Hiram Davis Medical Center next week.
