## OSIG SENIOR HOTLINE INVESTIGATOR ADDS NEW ROLE



The Virginia Office of the State Inspector General (OSIG) is pleased to announce that Senior Hotline Investigator Janet Crawford has been named Vice President for Membership and Operations for the Central Virginia Chapter of the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (RVACFES). In her new role, Crawford will assist in maintaining membership engagement and overall chapter operations.

Crawford, a certified fraud examiner (CFE), has been a member of RVACFES for 15 years. The organization offers monthly online training programs for certified fraud examiners and holds yearly training sessions jointly with the Virginia State Police in Chesterfield County.

"RVACFES offers continuing professional education for fraudfighting professionals like myself," said Crawford. "I look forward to encouraging more fraud examiners to join our organization to

take advantage of the networking and educational opportunities it offers."

Prior to joining OSIG in December 2018, Crawford worked as a senior auditor at the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Office of Charitable and Regulatory Programs. She also worked as a senior auditor for the State Employee Fraud, Waste and Abuse Hotline that was formerly housed within the Virginia Department of Accounts Division of State Internal Audit before it was moved to OSIG. Crawford continues to work on the same Hotline in her current position at OSIG.
